

RED BANK HOUSING IMPROVEMENT RESOURCES

All repairs are for low income, owner occupied homes in Red Bank City Limits.

1. Program: Emergency Repairs for the Elderly
Organization: South East Tennessee Development District
Contact: Dianne White
Description: Owner Occupied for aged 60 and above. Emergency repairs
With costs not to exceed 15K, requiring 1/3 match in donated
materials, volunteer labor, or cash.
Eligibility: Owner occupied and some income eligibility. Outright grant.
2. Widow's Harvest offers home repairs for income qualifying widows.
Dick Mason. Widow's Harvest needs volunteered materials and labor.
Widow's Harvest can also provide wheelchair ramps. Outright grant.
3. Habitat for Humanity can build new homes. Some capability of repairs.
John Lamb. Need donated land and volunteers. Income qualified and
recipient required to contribute time.
4. Weatherization Project from Chattanooga Neighborhood Enterprises.
Sarah Cate Patton. Income eligibility requirements
For weatherization: caulking, new windows, doors, insulation, HVAC.
Limit is around \$6500.00 per house. Outright grant.
5. Red Bank Cumberland Presbyterian Church. Eddie Pierce.
Provide some volunteers for repair work.
6. Home Builders' Association - Teresa Groves ED
Volunteer labor and materials.

Note that the matching requirement for programs like the SETDD "Emergency Repairs"
program could be met with labor or material contributions from any of the other five
resources listed above.
