Replacement of Lullwater Road Bridge

Category: Surface Transportation Block Grant

Sources of Funding: FHWA/TDOT/Local MPO STBG Grant 80/20

Purpose: Replacement of the one-lane bridge crossing Stringers Branch on Lullwater Road and adjacent to Signal Mountain Rd. (Approximately .11 miles).

- Subject bridge was initially constructed in 1950, before the City of Red Bank was incorporated.
- The bridge was re-constructed in 1992 to the current level of operation it is now.
- This has always been a one lane bridge and prior to 1992 had been a wooden decked bridge with 4X4 side rails.

Project Conception and Initial Cost Estimate:

- 2019 was the year of the grant application
- \$541,000 was the initial cost estimate at time of grant application
- Current project expiration date: 11/30/2026

History of this Project:

- 2/5/2019-Red Bank City Commission approved a TDOT grant application for this project, along with two other projects, under Resolution [19-1276](#)
- 8/4/2020-Red Bank City Commission approved the contract with TDOT for the grant project under Resolution [20-1360](#)
- 8/3/2021-Red Bank City Commission approved a contract with Volkert, Inc for Project Management for this project under Resolution [21-1421](#)
- 10/22/2025-The [CHCRPA/MPO](#) Executive Board approved \$1,169,759 of additional funding in the 2026-2029 TIP cycle for Fiscally Constrained Projects
- The current funding level available for this project is \$1,710,759 with MPO funding expected January 2026.
